MCCA ANNOUNCES ACM SIGGRAPH WILL HOST ANNUAL EVENT AT BCEC Event Will Return to Boston after 17 Years

The Massachusetts Convention Center Authority (MCCA) today announced that ACM SIGGRAPH will hold its annual convention at the Boston Convention & Exhibition Center (BCEC) in July 2006. SIGGRAPH, which is one of the largest technology shows in the country, last held their annual event in Boston in 1989.

Larson, Chair of the MCCA. "This announcement is helping us to keep up the momentum for bookings and as a full building event, it represents an enormous amount of room nights for Boston's hotels. This is a big win for us."

SIGGRAPH is a highly reputable conference and exhibit on computer graphics and interactive techniques. The conference is known for having unique and educational conference sessions, giving attendees an enormous opportunity to learn about, share and experience the latest technologies in the industry. The SIGGRAPH 2004 Annual Conference and Exhibition was held August 8-12 in Los Angeles and had nearly 230 exhibitors and more than 28,000 attendees.

"Home to numerous universities, graphic arts and technology companies, Boston is an excellent venue for SIGGRAPH," said John Finnegan, SIGGRAPH 2006 Conference Chair from Purdue University. "SIGGRAPH has grown tremendously since we last held an event in Boston.
